# ACHIEVEMENTS

## 2010

- ❑ Collected \$33,395,319 for children
- ❑ Worked at every level to identify and assist children in need of help
- ❑ Freed 125 children for adoption
- ❑ Assigned a prosecutor and victim advocate to the newly created Gateway Center for Domestic Violence Services
- ❑ Continued to prioritize prosecution of drug trafficking organizations; resulting in removal of 13.5 pounds of methamphetamine, 24.6 pounds of heroin, 3.7 pounds of cocaine, 5,360 marijuana plants and 792 pounds of marijuana
- ❑ Participated in establishing a first offender program which included the Sex Buyer Accountability and Diversion class and the New Options for Women Treatment Program
- ❑ Worked with the state and other safety partners to implement START (Success Through Accountability, Restitution and Treatment) Court; a post sentencing treatment court for felony property offenders
- ❑ Scanned over 4 million archived case documents into a new document management system (DMS)
- ❑ Continued to prioritize violent crime



# OUR CASES

- ❑ Reviewed 24,600 cases for adult prosecution
- ❑ Issued 4,552 adult felony cases
  - Over 1,300 violent felonies
  - Over 1,000 felony property offenses
  - Over 1,300 felony drug crimes
  - 367 felony domestic violence cases
- ❑ Issued 13,833 adult misdemeanor cases
- ❑ Protected over 700 children who were abused, neglected or abandoned
- ❑ Issued 510 juvenile delinquency cases
- ❑ 3,039 cases were resolved in Community Court with over 34,000 hours of community service
- ❑ Over \$1,950,000 in restitution was collected

## Goals for 2011

- ❑ Improve restitution collection and enforcement
- ❑ Continue to use flexible and innovative techniques to respond to public safety needs
- ❑ Launch a new website to help victims and witnesses navigate the criminal justice system
- ❑ Reduce long-term case storage costs by continuing to scan closed files into the DMS
- ❑ Seek new funding opportunities through new grant initiatives
- ❑ Participate in the new Homeless Court
